HERBS FOR A WINDOWSILL

These durable herbs are willing to spend the winter indoors growing on your windowsill without supplemental light. Although they'll grow more slowly during the winter, you'll still have a supply of fresh herbs to liven up your cooking. When spring arrives, transplant your windowsill herbs into the garden or move pots outdoors. Slowly transition the herbs to direct sun a little each day to avoid scorching.
